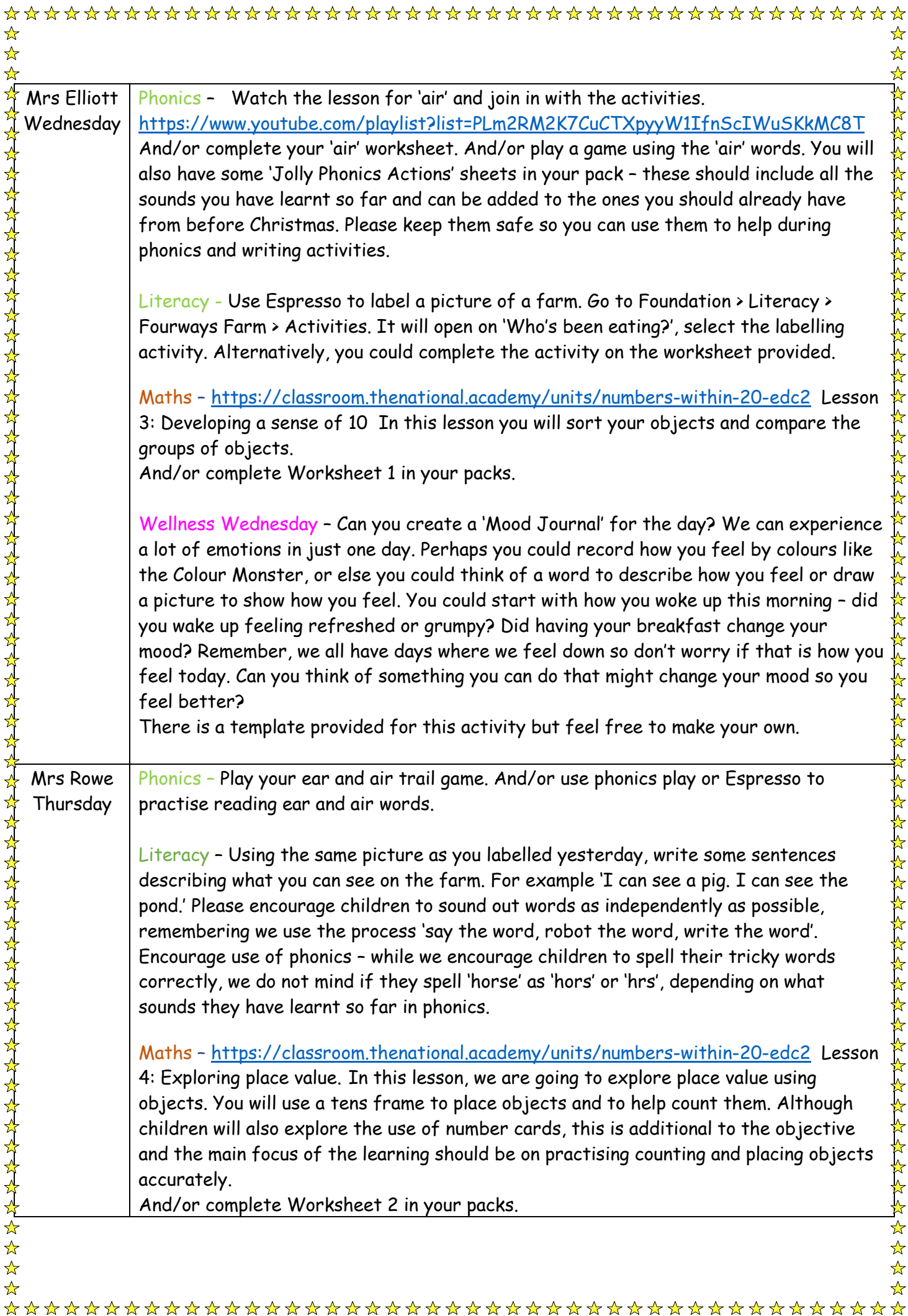

There is a third video, 'Phoenix the calf', which mentions foot and mouth disease and that lots of calves were killed due to the outbreak. You may or may not wish to watch this with your child.

Reggie will park his car on a hidden number. He will give you a 'one more than' clue and you will have to calculate the number of his parking space. You can play this game with your household and teddies at home.

**Forest Friday/Outdoor time** - Our key artist in Reception is Anthony Goldsworthy. He uses nature, photography and sculpture to produce his artwork. This week, we would like you to look at his rock sculptures (see photos in pack) and see if you can recreate some, or make some of your own in the same style. #### Ongoing tasks

Reading is as important as ever and we hope you are able to use the resources provided below to access more ways to read with your child/children. Oxford Owl provide free e-books that are the same as the children would be reading in school.

Please continue to count and look for numbers to 20 in everyday tasks, as well as encourage children to talk about size, weight and position. We are trying to encourage children to use language such as 'next to...' and 'under...' instead of pointing and saying "there!" if they are asked where something is. We are also encouraging children to use their words as much as possible for example, when asked what colour sticker they would like we ask them to actually tell us, rather than point at the sticker. These little actions really do make a huge difference.
